n the last edition of *The Bilum* I mentioned the new way of governing Mercy Works. I am pleased to report that the organisation is settling well into its new form. While the company resides in the Institute of the Sisters of Mercy of Australia and PNG all Mercy groups have representation at Board level and within the organisation. The support level, too, extends across all groups, with donations coming

from across the length and breadth of Australia.

I am grateful that Mercy Works is 'owned' by us all for it allows the work to be widely known and appreciated. It allows many good minded men and women across Australia to contribute to this work of Mercy. Our donor base is increasing with donations ranging from small to substantial. No matter the amount every dollar is gratefully received and is put to good use.

The membership of the Board has been enhanced with the addition of two new members, Chris Townend and Kathleen Donnellon. They bring with them expertise in finance and legal matters which is being put to good use. They, along with the continuing members, give most generously of their time and talents and this enables to Board to work most effectively to provide sound governance.

This year, too, has seen the beginning of Mercy Connect in Ballarat. Kathleen Moran RSM has begun the work in this provincial city, quickly recruiting twelve volunteers to run the program. With such a good response they began in August in the Catholic high school and one of the State high schools. It is anticipated the program will expand as more volunteers become available.

Another initiative this year has been the partnership formed with the Yula-Punaal Aboriginal Women's Centre at Mandalong NSW. This centre provides support for aboriginal women being released from prison, helping them to settle back into society. Mercy Works is pleased to fund the building of accommodation for these women.

There have been staff changes this year as well. Ailsa Mackinnon RSM has taken over as Executive Director and is settling well into her new role. She has been able to visit most of the projects during the course of the year. As well, there have been changes in the administration and finance areas, Mercy Connect Sydney and there is a new Community Education Co-ordinator. All in all, the office continues to run smoothly to support the work in the field.

For this financial year Mercy Works is committed to providing almost \$1 million in projects across Australia, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea and Timor-Leste. The work continues to expand and requests for aid are increasing. It is all the more important, then, that donations continue to come in. We are grateful for your continuing support and ask that you spread the news of this work to your many connections. Encourage your friends to become *Friends of Mercy Works*. In that way they commit themselves to regular donations and the work can be assured of a stable funding base.
